The LIFE programme is the EU's financial instrument supporting environmental, nature conservation and climate action projects throughout the EU.

The LIFE programme provides financial assistance to organisations working on environmental issues and climate action. The main objective of the programme is to support the implementation, updating and development of EU environment and climate policy and legislation by financing projects with European added value in this area. LIFE is endowed by the European Commission and managed by CINEA. It is structured in **four sub-programmes:**

- Nature and biodiversity: Expanding, protecting, preserving and nurturing nature for a sustainable and balanced future.
- Circular economy and quality of life: Waste is a resource and needs great management to render already available critical raw materials more accessible include air, water, soil, noise, chemicals and the new European Bauhaus.
- Climate change adaptation and mitigation: The areas of intervention include ozone-depletion, carbon sinks, nature-based solutions in the management of land, coasts and marine areas, adapting cities and regions to climate, preparedness for extreme weather events and more. How can we predict, prevent, mitigate and adapt.
- Clean energy transition: It aims to ease the transition towards an energy-efficient, renewable energy-based, climate-neutral and resilient economy by removing market barriers that can hamper the socio-economic transition to sustainable energy.
