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The Croatian Recovery and Resilience Plan provides a framework for achieving reforms and investments crucial for Croatia's faster recovery and its long-term sustainable development.

The reforms and investments in the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (NRRP) will help Croatia to become more sustainable, resilient and better prepared for the challenges and opportunities of the digital and green transitions towards a climateresilient economy ensuring social cohesion.

The NRRP consists of 146 investments and 76 reforms supported by  $\leq 6.3$  billion in grants whereas 40.3% are dedicated to climate objectives. All actions have to be implemented within a tight time frame, as the Regulation foresees their completion by August 2026.

The NRRP is centrally governed by the Government of the Republic of Croatia under responsibility of the Ministry of Finance. Its Steering Committee is chaired by the prime minister and all other sectorial ministers are members. Specific sectorial ministries are accountable for their jurisdiction including structure and design of calls. The NRRP is clustered in 6 components:

- Economy
- Public administration, judiciary and state assets
- Education, science and research
- Labour market and social protection
- Health
- Initiative: Renovation of buildings
