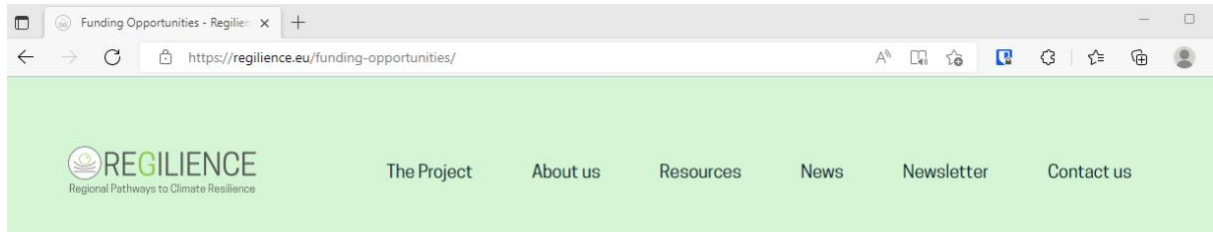

Regions and Communities will play a crucial role in preparing Europe for future challenges in respect to climate change. Their challenges and ambitions are well understood on European and national level and there is a strong political support for the regions. On European level for example the **European Mission Adaptation to Climate Change** aims to "Support at least 150 European regions and communities to become climate resilient by 2030".

Besides the political support on European and national level, financial support is available from various sources to support regional climate resilience ambitions. REGILIENCE developed a funding tool to raise awareness of available financial on European and national level dedicated to support regional climate resilience.

Funding opportunities are available for all different stages of the implementation; from strategy and concept development to pilot implementation, roll out and monitoring; as well as for all different sectors. 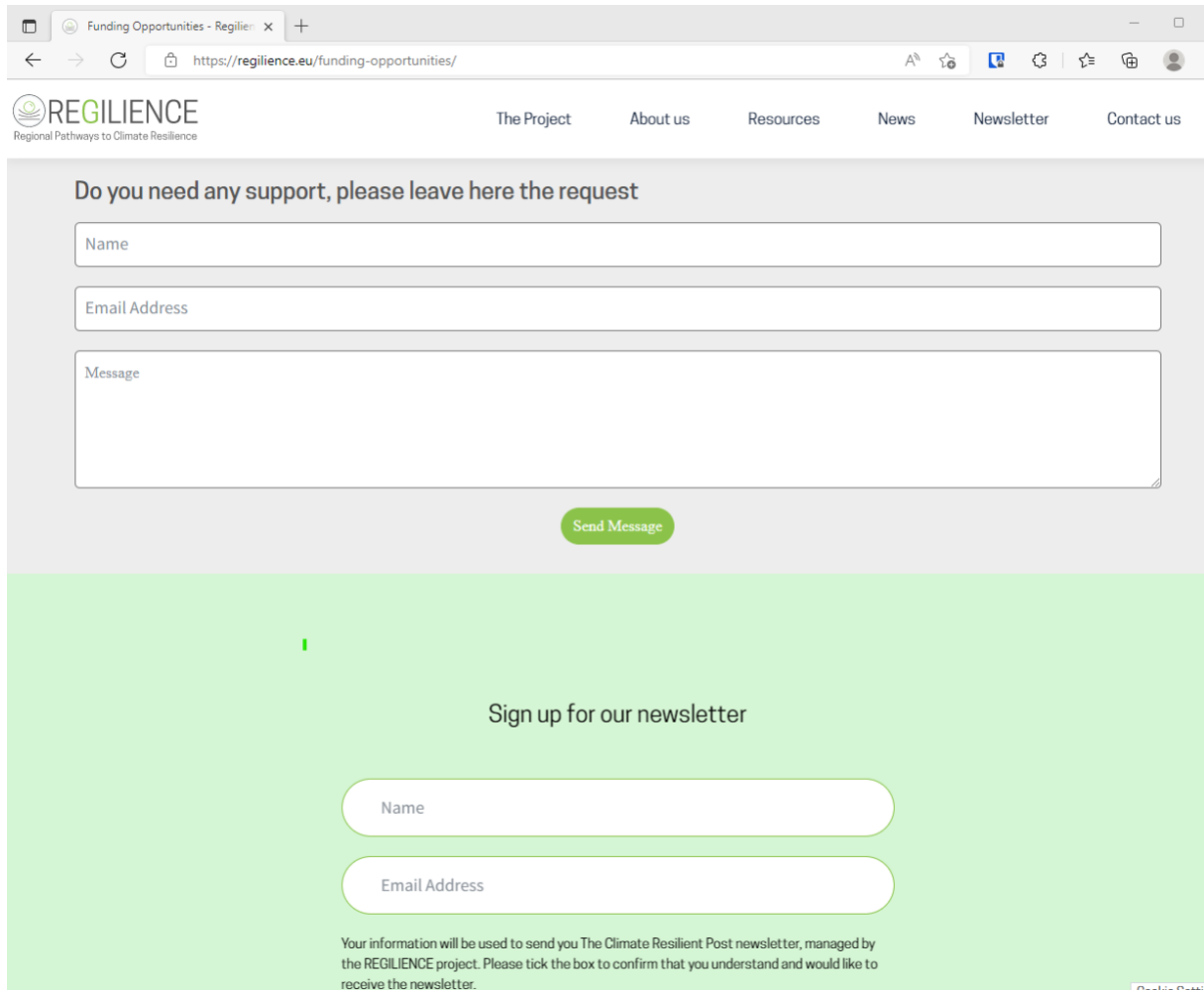


Figure 3. REGILIENCE funding opportunities - feedback and support form

Horizon Europe is the European Union's flagship Research and Innovation programme and part of the EU-long-term Multiannual Financial Framework 2021-2027.

Horizon Europe (HE) seeks to:

- Tackle climate change
- Contribute to achieving the UN Sustainable Development Goals
- Boost the EU's competitiveness and growth
- Facilitate collaboration and strengthen the impact of research and innovation in developing, supporting and implementing EU policies
- Support the creation and better diffusion of excellent knowledge and technologies
- Create jobs, boost economic growth, promote industrial competitiveness and optimise investment impact

The HE funding programme is based on the principle of co-financing. The European Commission allocates budget to specific topics and opens calls for proposals. The calls for proposals are clustered in different sub programmes grouped by subject areas ("destinations"), based on policy priorities and desired impact. HE is divided into three pillars corresponding to its main priorities (Excellent Science, Global Challenges and European Industrial Competitiveness, Innovative Europe) and one focus on the 5 mission areas. More details are explained on the next page including links to open calls for each area. All open calls are published on the Funding & Tenders portal.
