Mussel Culture

- About 40% of the European production in more than 3,000 rafts.
- Directly employs more than 5,000 people





Clam Farming and Shellfishing

 More than 600 farming parks and around 3,500 self-employed shellfish collectors (90% women)





1. Identifying the right stakeholders



Contacting and mobilising Key stakeholders representing clam an mussel KCS

- 2 KCS difficult to reach and get aligned opinions and solutions.
- Fragmented sectors: high number of selfemployed workers and some SMEs.
- Work on the sea and their agenda adapts to the weather and tidal conditions.



2. Planning and engagement approach

Clear objective: Understand climate perception, challenges and risks for the KCS and determine risk levels, critical thresholds and existing and new solutions.


CETMAR and Uvigo team:








4. Reporting and review
