








LISTEN AND TRANSFORM:

During 2018-2019, the citizens of Benicalap shared proposals and needs of the neighbourhood to improve and define the pilot projects: how to improve the connection with the Huerta, analysis of the quality of public space (hotter spots, degraded or less safe places).

• THREE SCALES OF INTERVENTION:

Territory (Huerta-City relationship).

Neighbourhood (urban public space).

Place (Nature-based solutions).

DISSEMINATE AND TEACH:

During 2022 was developed a dissemination and feedback programme to share the results of the project with different activities addressed to different audiences

FOUR LEVELS OF ACTION:

General public: workshops and conferences as well as recreational activities.

Educational entities: workshops and conferences with students from Benicalap.

Academia: workshops and conferences with the UPV and the UV.

Companies: workshops and conferences with businessmen and

women linked to the SBN.

- Management of the space by the associations
















Project objectives

- Enhance the value of the green spaces in the Campanar neighbourhood
- Encourage their protection and responsible use by the citizens
- Creation of a public policy proposal to help improve and adapt these spaces to the needs of the population.


Singularity

- Citizens evaluate themselves and propose alternatives to improve the use of their own green spaces
- Pilot experience of citizen participation transferable to other municipalities and applicable to other types of public policies
- Implementation of citizen proposals extracted from the participatory evaluation process itself.
