Gender Statement

The need for gender mainstreaming arises from persistent inequalities in power distribution and access to services and opportunities between people of different sex and/or gender identities. As demonstrated by literature and advocated in the European and international arena, this influences the understanding and perception of climate change dynamics and effects. Women and men, but also people in the LGBTQI+ community, are differently affected by the accelerated change of climate. Only by taking into consideration their diverse visions can scientific research reach meaningful and universal conclusions that properly inform climate action.

For these reasons, the REGILIENCE consortium is committed to including gender and intersectionality as a transversal aspect in the project's activities. In line with EU guidelines and objectives, all partners – including the authors of this deliverable – recognise the importance of advancing gender analysis and sex-disaggregated data collection in the development of scientific research. We commit to paying specific attention to including, monitoring and periodically evaluating the participation of different genders in all activities developed within the project, including workshops, webinars, and events but also surveys, interviews and research, in general. While applying a non-binary approach to data collection and promoting the participation of all genders in the activities, the partners will periodically reflect and inform about the limitations of their approach. Through an iterative learning process, they commit to plan and implement strategies that maximise the inclusion of more and more intersectional perspectives in their activities.

This deliverable highlights the importance of stakeholder engagement to have equal balance of different gender identities. The stakeholder engagement activities also illustrate different types of approach at a different step of the engagement process. This is developed with a consideration of various dynamics and interests of women, men, and people in the LGBTQI+.



Executive Summary

This the Stakeholder Engagement, Communication and Dissemination plan serves as a strategic report, providing the approach for and reporting on activities implemented in the following tasks:

- T1.3 Network knowledge exchange, led by ICLEI
- T1.4 Capacity-building of regions, led by FEDARENE
- T1.5 Engagement of citizens and wider dissemination, led by F6S

While the first version of the report presented the approach for such activities and a plan for the first and second reporting period, this second version presents a **roadmap for communication, dissemination and stakeholder engagement activities**, which reflects on lessons learnt from the **implemented activities until October 2024**, also reported in this deliverable.

The roadmap's varied activities are organised using the **Stakeholder Engagement Spectrum**, which categorises stakeholder engagement and communication activities into five levels of engagement, from Informing to Empowering, across EU, national, regional, and local levels.

To this moment, the project has successfully implemented several activities under each level, resulting in impact and KPI achievement.

- **Inform:** 21 articles, 15 joint newsletters, 6 videos, 15 factsheets and infographics, 5 visuals presentation/ brochures,
- **Consult:** 4 interviews, 12 conferences, 1 active helpdesk, 11 joint events, 1 available tool translated in 10 languages
- **Involve:** 6 joint workshops with Innovation Action projects, 13 workshops
- **Collaborate:** 3 co-design workshops, 1 joint publication, 2 peer-to-peer mentorships
- **Empower:** tailored training sessions for the focus regions.

As much as possible, these activities are planned according to a **joint editorial calendar**, which is a collaboration among REGILIENCE and the three Innovation Actions (IAs) – [TransformAr](#), [IMPETUS](#), and [ARSINOE](#). Together, the four projects successfully organise joint communication and dissemination actions, as well as joint engagement activities, aiming to expand outreach and engage wider audiences, contributing to the project's overarching goal of fostering climate resilience.

This report is subject to modifications for the final report “Stakeholder Engagement, Communication and Dissemination Plan, v3” that is foreseen in M48 (D1.7). We invite readers to get a comprehensive picture of REGILIENCE communication, dissemination and stakeholder engagement actions by reading the set of reports produced by partners in the following scope:

1. Introduction

Communication and dissemination actions are crucial for a successful project and so is having essential stakeholders engaged for a fruitful exploitation and the uptake of project results. The project intends to boost the potential of demonstrating and showcasing results mainly from REGILIENCE and the IA projects into practice through carefully thought out and agreed-upon stakeholder engagement, communication, and dissemination activities.

While the first version focused on the project's strategy to engage stakeholders, communicate and disseminate projects results, this second version outlines the key milestones and successes achieved by implementing the strategy in the following tasks:

- T1.3 Network knowledge exchange, led by ICLEI
- T1.4 Capacity-building of regions, led by FEDARENE
- T1.5 Engagement of citizens and wider dissemination, led by F6S

It also includes potential areas for improvement for the last project year, with activities to be reported in the fourth and final version of this report, which will be submitted in M48, building on how to exploit project results and reporting on activities of the project 4 years.

The **communication and dissemination activities** aim to maximise the project's impact by providing specific and detailed information on project results to our targeted audiences (local and regional decision makers, public-private development institutions, research groups on climate adaptation and institutional governance and change, related think tanks, civil society organisations and citizens, etc.). At the same time, REGILIENCE is targeting larger audiences - the general public - to promote the project and increase its visibility.

In contrast to communication and dissemination efforts that aim to reach a wider audience, the **stakeholder engagement activities** are focused on supporting regions, mainly the 7 focus regions and the stakeholders associated with them. These 7 focus regions are European regions amongst the most vulnerable to climate change, selected by the project to receive capacity building and other types of support to initiate or strengthen their climate resilience pathways. Therefore, this document emphasises the support offered to the focus regions and efforts in building climate resilience.

Recommendations concerning future work from the Reporting Period 1 (M18) have been considered in this second version. The new additions include a more targeted communication and dissemination plan to:

- effectively share project results in the local languages, focusing on the communication strategies for external users,



- enlarge the list of key stakeholders in the target regions and a broader audience to achieve greater social impacts with REGILIENCE outputs.

More importantly, the document presents a roadmap of engagement activities planned for the rest of the project duration until October 2025.

The communication, dissemination and stakeholder engagement activities are presented through the **Stakeholder Engagement Spectrum**, with five levels of engagement - informing, consulting, involving, collaborating, and empowering - from sharing basic information to active engagement and empowerment. The Spectrum is used as a roadmap of engagement activities, which serves as the central monitoring / overview of these activities implemented in other tasks.

More detailed information for these activities is further explained in the following deliverables:

This report offers a broad summary of the stakeholder engagement, communication, and dissemination activities, while the other deliverables provide detailed insights of each activity and the project outcomes. To avoid duplication and ensure effective coordination in developing the WP1 deliverables, the partners involved have closely collaborated in the process of writing this report.

The last and final report (D1.7 Stakeholder Engagement, Communication and Dissemination Plan, with timelines and design v.3) will be submitted in month 48 of the project (October 2025), which will consist of a complete reporting of communication, dissemination, stakeholder engagement activities, lessons learned and achievements.



1.1. Objectives

The objective of the second version of this report is to ensure the coordination of the activities developed in tasks 1.3, 1.4, and 1.5 and to monitor the communication, dissemination, and stakeholder engagement activities towards REGILIENCE's key stakeholders and the broader community. These activities facilitate communication, collaboration, and capacity-building among a wide range of professionals and citizens, ensuring a more innovative, focused, and secure design process for outreach efforts that serve the targets' different interests.

Given the nature of the project -a coordination and support action-, REGILIENCE also coordinates and supports the IAs ([TransformAr](#), [IMPETUS](#), and [ARSINOE](#)) to amplify the impact of their results. It coordinates actions among the four projects and maximises benefits in their target regions and the communities affected by climate change. REGILIENCE specifically supports the implementation and wide dissemination of the solutions developed by the IAs and other projects, and maximises its impacts through complimentary measures undertaken by REGILIENCE and the IAs to:

- Adapt the planned activities according to local and regional needs, sharing information and developing tools and solutions to assist in their efforts for resilience and climate adaptation.
- Promote and share ideas on climate solutions through exchange knowledge and results bringing ideas to people in many activities.
- Assist in supporting the main target audiences (local/ regional authorities, agencies, and other stakeholders) towards climate resilience pathways through a helpdesk, peer-to-peer mentorship, back-to-back physical and online events, and much more.
- Disseminate good practices through tailored trainings and strengthen resilience in 7 focus regions.
- Engage the citizens and foster their awareness in the adoption of climate resilience and broadening the outreach of the project in the local languages.
- Share results, lessons learned and informational materials from the IAs, Mip4Adapt, and other relevant projects/initiatives in various formats (infographics, videos, joint newsletters) and languages easy to understand to a wider audience.

It is essential to involve stakeholders in communication and dissemination efforts to ensure the stakeholders active participation, promote cooperation, and optimise the project's impact. The stakeholder engagement activities ensure that our main target audiences, including local communities, policymakers, researchers, and industry leaders, are informed, involved, consulted, collaborative, and empowered to contribute to the project's goals.



1.2. Impacts and KPIs

REGILIENCE aims to foster the adoption and wide dissemination of regional climate resilience pathways, following a demand-driven approach and bearing in mind the expertise and knowledge acquired, as well as the solutions available from Innovation Actions and other sources. It provides wide dissemination of the solutions and approaches within networks, regional authorities and key stakeholders, including civil society organisations and citizens. Furthermore, it provides support and builds the capacity of vulnerable regions to create or further develop their climate resilience pathways.

As a result, WP1 Engagement, Communication, and Dissemination stands out in terms of budget allocation, range of activities, and overall impact. The impact targets and Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) related to these activities, and their achievement by October 2024, are presented below.

2. Stakeholder Engagement, Communication and Dissemination

2.1. Stakeholder Engagement Spectrum

The **REGILIENCE Stakeholder Engagement Spectrum** was created to present the communication, dissemination and stakeholder engagement activities in a coherent way. It organises such activities into different levels of engagement – from informing to empowering. It is inspired from the Stakeholder Engagement Spectrum¹ presented in Figure 1, which is the adaptation of the Public Participation Spectrum² developed by the International Association of Public Participation (IAP2), focused on public participation for decision-making.

Drawing inspiration from the spectrum, REGILIENCE Stakeholder Engagement Spectrum uses the five levels of engagement to present the project's activities aimed at effectively engaging stakeholders, including the communication and dissemination efforts, depending on specific objectives, timelines, resources, and stakeholder interests.

The engagement levels vary from simple information sharing to co-creation of project's activities, based on the five levels of engagement: inform, consult, involve, collaborate, and empower. These levels set clear directions for project activities and are based on expectations for different stakeholders' interest, defined in the previous version of this report. Each level is explained in the table below.

This level is characterised by one-way communication, from the project to the audience, aimed at keeping stakeholders up to date on knowledge, tools, and solutions developed by REGILIENCE, other projects (especially the Innovation Actions and other Mission projects) and the Mission on Adaptation without requiring their feedback or direct participation. Consult	To actively gather insights from stakeholders to enhance and refine REGILIENCE tools and activities. The REGILIENCE engagement methods and activities planned for regions, the IAs, and a broad range of target groups cover all these engagement levels and are explicitly detailed in the next section of this report. Overall, these activities allow REGILIENCE to promote knowledge transfer to a wide range of audiences, such as the end-users in the targeted regions and beyond, local authorities, their support organisations, and national decision-makers.



REGILIENCE has several communication and dissemination activities to inform, consult, and involve our target groups in messages on climate adaptation and resilience development. Furthermore, effective engagement activities were and will be conducted to encourage collaboration and empowerment of stakeholders in climate resilience.

2.2. Activities

The engagement methods and activities mentioned in the REGILIENCE Stakeholder Engagement Spectrum (Table 1) are further explained below.

- **Article:** Key findings or project results typically to share knowledge or disseminate results to a broader audience.
- **Codesign workshops:** Sessions that facilitate the swift creation, validation, and redevelopment of ideas, while simultaneously securing alignment and support from various stakeholders.
- **Communication campaigns:** A coordinated effort to convey targeted messages to specific audiences using various channels, aiming to raise awareness, and influence behaviour change.
- **Exploitable brochures:** Informative printed or digital materials to highlight and promote key results, innovations, or outcomes for attracting potential stakeholders.
- **Fact sheets:** Similar to infographics with concise, visually engaging information that is easy to understand.
- **Focus groups:** Bring together small groups of stakeholders with similar interests to discuss specific topics or issues in a facilitated setting.
- **Helpdesk support:** A service embedded in the project website to provide assistance and solutions for technical issues, questions, or problems related to materials or services.
- **Infographics:** Visual representation of research, findings, information, or knowledge using minimum text while still engaging and easy to understand for the wider audience.
- **Interviews:** Conduct individual interviews to delve into stakeholders' opinions, concerns, and suggestions in greater detail.
- **Joint events:** Collaborative efforts in gatherings or participations at an event or conference to share information or knowledge and network among participants.
- **Joint workshops:** Collaborative sessions where participants from various organisations come together to share knowledge, skills, and expertise on a specific topic.
- **Journal publications:** Articles published in the professional journals to present original research, findings, or reviews, typically peer-reviewed to ensure credibility.
- **Media/ newsletters:** Joint newsletters with the IAs about the latest work or upcoming events that are regularly distributed to a subscribed audience.
- **Meetings:** Arrange face-to-face interactions with stakeholders, such as one-on-one (online) meetings, or larger stakeholder assemblies where stakeholders and the public can contribute their input and feedback.
- **Online collaboration tools:** Employ shared documents, project management software, or virtual whiteboards to facilitate stakeholder collaboration and information sharing.
- **Open seminars:** Educational or informational sessions open to the wider audience, usually allowing participants to engage with experts for a specific topic.
- **Peer-to-peer learning exchanges:** Sharing learning experiences, challenges, and good practice from different stakeholder groups to foster ongoing engagement and collaboration.
- **Posters:** Digital displays that present information, data, or ideas visually, often combining text and graphics used in conferences or events.
- **Presentations:** A form of communication delivered in a visual format, where one conveys information, ideas, or research findings to enhance understanding and engagement.



- **Surveys and questionnaires:** Collect structured feedback and perspectives from stakeholders through online or offline surveys.
- **Video clips:** Short videos to highlight key moments or to convey a message.
- **Webinars:** Deliver informative presentations or host webinars to update stakeholders on project progress and encourage interactive discussions.
- **Workshops:** Conduct collaborative problem-solving sessions with the stakeholders, using interactive activities and group exercises to encourage meaningful discussions.

From November 2022 until September 2024, REGILIENCE has implemented most of these engagement methods and activities, as shown in the table below. The engagement activities are organised per engagement level, following the REGILIENCE Stakeholder Engagement Spectrum, including information on the type of activity, target audience and reach, and the date of implementation. Several activities highlighted in **light green colour** are planned activities expected to be implemented from October 2024 until the end of the project (October 2025).

Key stakeholders are empowered by a project when they participate in organised events and activities including workshops, training sessions, and cooperative meetings. Through the provision of information, expertise, and resources, these activities empower project participants to actively contribute to the project's objectives, make informed choices, and impact positive change in their respective sectors or communities. REGILIENCE chose to cluster its activities to increase the outreach potential of the project concepts and raise awareness among a broader spectrum of stakeholders. To provide support to the focus regions and local communities, the project emphasizes on possible innovative participation which includes of event engagement, capacity building programme, and citizen engagement.

Event engagement

This section aims to give an overview of the engagement through events that the Consortium has achieved so far and what is left in the last year of the project.

Until October 2024, REGILIENCE has actively organised and participated in 6 large events over the last 3 years of the project, namely:

- [the 3rd EU Macro-Regional Strategies Week](#),
- [the 9th-10th and 11th European Urban Resilience Forum](#),
- [the 20th European Week of Regions and Cities](#), and
- [the High-level event of the Mission for Adaptation Climate Change for Greek Cities and Regions](#).

The consortium is committed also in this final year of the project to take advantage of upcoming and future relevant large-scale events for accelerating knowledge sharing and contribute to a successful development of the project expected outcomes. A mapping of the conferences and interest is still in development and will be carried out until the end of the project.



The key activities dedicated to event engagement are:

- **Large-scale event:** Refers to an event involving a significant number of participants, which take place either as stand-alone events or most likely within other established events with sub-focus on regional resilience.
- **Peer-to-peer mentorship:** Refers to a cooperative learning process in which the activity involves various levels of knowledge and departments to exchange information, offer good practice and potential solutions.

Capacity building activities

The following section outlines the capacity building programme to support the regional and local authorities as well as the local communities within the 7 focus regions. These initiatives are critical to helping local and regional change agents overcome institutional, financial, and regulatory barriers. They also assist them in putting adaptation measures into place and educate them about the potential and difficulties associated with adopting solutions being developed in other projects.

The key activities dedicated to citizen engagement are:

- **General webinars and workshops in the form of Open Training Sessions (OTS):** To aim at building up capacities in interested European regions and their key actors engaging them from their current knowledge on climate resilience. The first cycle of the OTS has been implemented and the second cycle will soon be implemented from October 2024 until the end of the project.
- **Regional training tailor-made to the region's needs and interests (RTS):** To provide information for the REGILIENCE focus regions and an in-depth exchange between regional actors and experts from the REGILIENCE project cluster and beyond. The RTS will be finalised in September 2025, right before the end of the project.
- **Peer-to-peer activities in the form of twinning (P2P):** To share direct and inspiring experiences from peer professionals and other representatives from regional or urban authorities. The mentorships will offer an opportunity to think critically and incorporate knowledge from many regional applications, acquiring firsthand knowledge about obstacles, resolutions, acquired knowledge, and possibilities for replication. The P2P has started in the second half of 2023 throughout the end of the project.
- **The opportunity to test Public-Private Partnerships (PPPs):** To co-explore innovative approaches to PPPs and opportunities for innovation in existing and ongoing PPPs in the focus regions, as well as strengthening the local enabling environment for further uptake of these innovations. The implementation of workshops with local authorities, private sector stakeholders and citizen groups will take place in the end of 2024 and the outcomes will be closely monitored in 2025.
- **Helpdesk:** To respond to specific requests or demands from focus regions or key actors by providing practical information or technical assistance oriented to pave the way for developing regional resilience pathways. The helpdesk will be accessible primarily to focus regions and additionally to the regional partners from the sister projects.

Citizen engagement



The following section outlines the citizen engagement strategy and activities to reach citizens carried out between M18 and M36 of the project. Additionally, the mentioned document defines planned activities to be performed until M47.

The key activities dedicated to citizen engagement are:

- **Citizen Survey:** This tool is gathering data to assess and monitor citizens' perceptions of climate change, adaptation needs, and aspirations. The citizen survey has been tested in Central Macedonia region at the beginning of 2024 and it is planned to conduct the survey again in the same region at the beginning of 2025 to compare the outcomes with those from the initial phase.
- **Community Events:** Events such as open seminars and training sessions are organized to engage citizens in interactive and enjoyable activities that promote resilience and adaptation to climate change. During 2025, 4 online Open Seminars are planned to emphasize the importance of enhancing the resilience and adaptation of regions and local communities. Additionally, REGILIENCE partners will develop informative sessions, targeting different citizen groups. Regarding the timeline, this activity started in M19 and will continue until the end of the project, therefore the majority of events are expected to be delivered in 2025.
- **Direct Support:** This activity enables citizens to share personal concerns through peer-to-peer support, with the team addressing specific questions and needs. The REGILIENCE project has already received more than 40 requests, through the website contact forms and by email, on many different topics. The REGILIENCE website already supported a total of 9099 downloads of opinion articles, reports and findings, funding opportunities, for citizens all over Europe.
- **Continuous feeding of the social media channels, newsletters and project website:** These activities aim to be the main place for knowing the most recent news about the project and to keep the contact with the REGILIENCE team. REGILIENCE has implemented 9 main social media communication activities to engage with its community and to disseminate information about the project's goals and progress.

2.3. Collaborating with Innovation Actions (IAs) and others – amplifying our work and messages

Within REGILIENCE tools and solutions for implementing Innovation Actions (IAs) in regions, cooperation and a coordinated approach will be developed towards a fully functional and free-access online platform or the upgrading of current knowledge-exchange platforms to provide user-friendly information on IAs, as well as on other online knowledge platforms to be shared. Reaching out to the IAs ([TransformAr](#), [IMPETUS](#), and [ARSINOE](#) projects) emphasise the project in disseminating the key messages through digital networking (such as platforms, joint newsletters, associations, NGOs, among others). It is anticipated that the Climate-ADAPT portal serves as the main European resource for resilience and adaptation, and that the IAs expands the wider outreach to their respective stakeholders. In addition, REGILIENCE also collaborates with The Mission Implementation Platform (MIP4Adapt) in building a Community of Practice to share knowledge, experiences, and good practices, and to promote coordination and collaboration amongst industry experts.



To foster synergies in disseminating climate resilience pathways, REGILIENCE engages other similar Mission-funded projects, namely [Pathways2Resilience](#) (P2R), [PROVIDE](#), [CoCliCo](#), [REACHOUT](#), [AGORA](#), [CLIMAAX](#), [IMAGINE Adaptation](#), [FutuResilience](#), [I-CISK](#), [LOCALISED](#), [NetZeroCities](#), [RESIST](#), [CARDIMED](#), among others. Nonetheless, there is a lot of space for the platforms to work together, particularly when it comes to targeting customers from other industries. These platforms are frequently used to exchange and upload news about projects, and they can also be used as a media channel. This is different from traditional media in that news can be uploaded straight onto the platforms, eliminating the need to submit a press release and wait for it to be picked up.

The collaboration with the IAs has been done through several methods such as bilateral meetings, joint workshop, collaboration through social media showcasing joint events (Urban Resilience Forum, The Mission, Community of Practice, EU Regional Weeks, among others).

2.4. Joint editorial calendar for engagement activities

REGILIENCE is coordinating and developing an editorial plan to consolidate ideas and content from the Innovation Actions (IAs). To effectively organise this content, including events and articles, the strategy is set to establish quarterly themes. Annex – Joint Editorial Calendar is a screenshot of the Miro board created to facilitate collaboration, allowing the projects (REGILIENCE, TransformAr, IMPETUS, and ARSINOE) to contribute ideas for actions or planned activities under these themes. The feedback from other projects is considered and is essential to ensure the proposed subjects and themes are matching and comprehensive. The aim is to confirm that the projects are not overlooking any critical topics related to resilience and adaptation. By working together, the IA projects create a robust editorial plan that effectively showcases the insights and activities of the REGILIENCE project and its contributions to enhancing climate resilience.

2.5. Media and scientific publications

REGILIENCE consortium commits to publish the overall project results on the project website, publications and seminars, without charging intellectual property rights. Academic and industry experts within REGILIENCE published in peer-reviewed journals and magazines, present papers/posters at conferences and other relevant events, and contribute to technical literature and specialised journals to spread research findings and raise awareness within the scientific community. 3. Monitoring methods and means of verification

The monitoring methods and means of verification of the communication and dissemination activities within REGILIENCE typically include a combination of tools and activities to track progress, such as:

- **Master file:** includes Gantt chart, Milestones, Deliverables, Activities tracker, and KPI tracker. Each tab of the tables outlines tasks, timelines, due dates, lead and supporting partners. These are regularly updated to easily track progress.
- **Monitoring file:** tracks achievements and implementation of activities, events, workshops, meetings, trainings, etc. This file is populated and updated at every activity or event that REGILIENCE is invited to and/or organising.
- **Bimonthly meeting with the IAs on strategic communication:** oversees issues or delays and serves as checkpoints in ongoing tasks, discuss and overcome challenges as well as adapting the joint activities plan if needed. The regular meetings ensure accountability and maintain focus on sharing information.
- **Workshops in project meetings:** interactive sessions involving regional and local authorities from 7 focus regions, the Innovative Action projects (TransformAr, IMPETUS, and ARSINOE), EEA, and DG CLIMA among others.

Verification channels for communication and dissemination are crucial for evaluating the success of the project's outreach and distribution activities. The measures and records used to monitor, assess, and prove the effectiveness of communication efforts during the project lifecycle are referred to as these means of verification.

One of the primary means of verification is the **use of communication metrics**. These include strategic communication and targeted action to reach a multitude of audiences, such as:

- Articles
- Workshops/ Webinars
- Large events
- Meetings
- Helpdesk support
- Peer-to-peer exchanges
- Journal publication
- Website
- Training sessions
- Media
- Promotional materials
- Social media campaigns
- Joint newsletters

Dissemination and exploitation activities are integrated across the entire workplans to ensure a continuous, sustained effort in promoting the project's activities and outcomes. In order to secure a broad audience and the support of key stakeholders, REGILIENCE emphasises in establishing intensive cooperation with EU initiatives, events, media outlets, and platforms that focus on energy and climate. These outcomes are widely implemented and utilised to attract interests from both local and regional authorities, national decisionmakers, and other relevant institutions through:



- Initiatives and platforms of the Adaptation Mission, Covenant of Mayors for Climate and Energy, European Energy Agency.
- Networks and associated initiatives such as Green Deal Projects, Community of Practice, MIP4ADAPT, European Sustainable Energy Week, European Week of Regions and Cities, European Energy Transition, Urban Resilience Forum.
- Open-source database such as Open Resource Europe.

In addition to engaging regional policy stakeholders and implementing bodies, the involvement of citizens is crucial throughout the process. Specific actions are planned to ensure that key messages are consistently communicated to the general public, while also gathering their feedback at every stage of the solution development. The monitoring and means of verification developed over the course of the project are continuously monitored to ensure that results are effectively transferred to the wider audiences.



4. Conclusion

REGILIENCE has implemented strategic communication, dissemination, and engagement activities to enhance climate resilience in European regions. As a Coordination and Support Action (CSA), the project has focused on sharing key results from REGILIENCE and other EU-funded projects, mainly the Innovation Actions ARSINOE, TransformAr, and IMPETUS. Our approach is rooted in strong collaboration and cooperation with IAs and other relevant Mission projects and initiatives, such as MIP4Adapt and Pathways2Resilience, in order to maximise impact, ensure widespread dissemination of climate resilience innovation packages and solutions while, at the same time, avoiding overlaps of activities among the projects and initiatives.

The activities implemented were organised into 5 levels of engagement, from inform to empower, as described in Table 1. REGILIENCE Stakeholder Engagement Spectrum, and presented in detail in section 2.2 Activities. While “Inform” activities aim at communicating climate resilience and adaptation to a wider audience across Europe, the “Empower” activities build the capacity of the 7 focus regions in climate resilience and adaptation, supporting key Local and Regional Authorities and regional stakeholders in creating their climate resilience pathway.

As “Inform” activities, key project findings have been transformed into accessible formats such as visual infographics, factsheets, and brief with impactful messages. These materials are adapted into local languages. By focusing on visual content and simplified messages, the project seeks to bridge the gap between scientific findings and public understanding, enhancing accessibility for citizens across different cultural contexts. Social media platforms have been employed to further disseminate these findings in the local languages, expanding outreach and helping to engage audiences who might otherwise have been excluded due to language barriers.

An example of “Empower” activity is the recent capacity-building activity in Istria, Croatia, where more than 20 stakeholders joined the one-day event “Climate change and adaptation in Istria: From planning to local action”³. It combined presentations of experts from REGILIENCE and the region with lively discussions on how Istria can prepare for present and projected climate hazards. The event introduced the concepts of resilience and climate adaptation, showcased relevant examples and tools, and covered the European legislative framework and how the region can access EU support.

The event in Istria was combined with REGILIENCE’s Management Board meeting, where partners have developed a **strategy** to continue supporting the 7 focus regions and beyond, making full use of existing resources and upcoming project activities. Discussions were based on the European Court of Auditors’ (ECA) [Special Report 15/2024, Climate Adaptation in the EU – Action Not Keeping Up with Ambition](#), which states that EU platforms are currently underutilised and insufficiently accessible for LRAs addressing climate adaptation.

The REGILIENCE partners agreed that the project’s final year should focus on bringing selected and relevant resources of EU platforms and initiatives to LRAs, supporting them in creating or enhancing their climate resilience pathways. This will cover information on extreme climate events, curated tools specifically designed to support LRAs, and details on EU support available to regions and communities. Such information will be disseminated through REGILIENCE channels, materials, and capacity-building activities, including workshops like the one organised in Istria. This should be done through collaboration with the IAs and other projects and, therefore, the strategy has already been presented and discussed with them in the projects cluster communication meeting held in beginning of November 2024.
